OUR MISSION

Founded in 2007, Harambee USA Foundation is one of seven associate foundations that make up Harambee International. It is a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization designed to promote international solidarity and cooperation with sub-Saharan African countries.

Our two-fold mission is:

- To support sustainable educational and developmental initiatives that help Africans help themselves.
- To promote awareness-building programs for all ages which transmit the richness and complexity of African culture.



2020 PROJECTS

The year 2020 was unprecedented due to the pandemic, and our NGO (non-government organization) partners in Africa were in dire need of support for their healthcare emergency needs. Harambee USA was there to help when needed most.

In 2020, we funded initiatives in DR Congo, Kenya, Nigeria and Ivory Coast.

Democratic Republic of Congo

The goal of the **“Forfait Mama”** project at Monkole Hospital, Kinshasa in DR Congo is to reduce the high rates of maternal and child mortality through the care of patients from the beginning of pregnancy through postnatal consultations and treatment of possible neonatal problems. Forfait Mama is one of several social programs at Monkole Hospital, which provides quality healthcare to the disadvantaged population of the region.



Ivory Coast / Nigeria

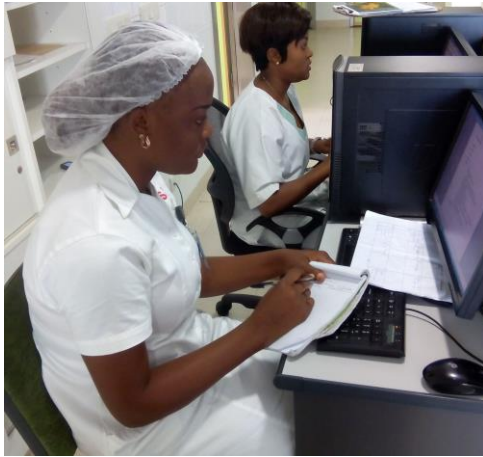
Wale Health Center / Niger Foundation Hospital

- In Ivory Coast, Wale has urgent needs to treat COVID-19 patients, including cleaning supplies, personal protective equipment (PPE) for nurses, oxygen tanks, remote training materials and ventilators.
- In Nigeria, private hospitals are not equipped to treat COVID-19 positive patients, and many public hospitals have closed out of fear because they do not have adequate resources to treat infected patients.

Kenya - Fr. Gibillini Nursery School

Started by the Ivrea Sisters in 2014, this school in the Diocese of Homa Bay works with neglected children, particularly those who are HIV-positive. The school supports the children's emotional, mental and social well-being by providing education, skills training and health programs. It seeks to build and operate a chicken farm to help meet strong local demand for poultry products while generating income and creating jobs for some recent graduates.





Democratic Republic of Congo

Tuition Assistance Program

Monkole Hospital in Kinshasa is home to the Institut Supérieur en Science Infirmières (ISSI), the top-ranked nursing school in DR Congo. Now that Harambee USA has raised its \$56,000 targeted funding for the Nursing Scholarship Program which ends in 2022, Harambee USA has established a Tuition Assistance Program to subsidize the schooling of incoming nursing students.
