## Beneficiaries & Grants

<b>Mozambique</b> (Gurue Teaching and Agriculture Center Association) In rural areas where there is no electricity and running water, the program aims to a) create agricultural opportunity per family b) establish chicken cooperative for egg production income c) promote the role of women in communities d) train women in basic health care and nutrition and e) teach orchard production on a rotating basis. (Harambee USA partners with Harambee Portugal)	150 families Grant: \$5,000
<b>Ivory Coast</b> (Wale Health Center) Wale Health Center has a Maternity unit in Tomboukro, DR Congo, where pregnant women from neighboring towns come for pre-natal check-ups, birth delivery and post natal services. The location of the maternity center is close to a tribe, where the chieftain is friendly with Wale president and health providers, and allows the women in his tribe to use the center for their health needs. Supporting Wale Health has significantly brought down mortality rates for both babies and mothers.	About 30 women Grant: \$2,000
<b>DR Congo</b> (Institut Superieur en Science Infirmieres) Monkole Hospital's nursing school, ISSI, has reached out to Harambee USA to help defray tuition costs through a Tuition Assistance program. For the Spring semester 2022, 5 remaining NSP scholars receive tuition scholarship, while 12 students are receiving TAP assistance of \$3k in 2021 Fall sem. The nursing graduates become role models and leaders in their respective communities.	5 students for NSP 12 students for TAP Grant: \$9,500
<b>Tanzania</b> (Sister of St Therese of Child Jesus- Bukoba) The Theresian sisters founded and run Hekima Secondary school for Girls. The three project for computer literacy for the students involve: a) set up of desk computers in Hekima 2) teach technical skills in applications such as MSFT Word, Excel, Powerpoint, and searching the internet and 3) expand the library to include books on food and nutrition	300 Secondary school Students Grant: \$10,000
<b>Nigeria</b> (Niger Hospital Foundation) Niger Hospital requested to help purchase a ventilator which was highly needed in their Intensive care unit. The ventilator was purchased through the financial assistance of Harambee USA. The presence of an additional ventilator has helped the hospital manage the surge in serious COVID cases.	Hospital ICU Grant: \$10,000
<b>SPAIN –</b> Guadalupe Scholarship Harambee Spain is the administrator of the Scholarship for Graduate Studies in Scientific Research (for African women). The program helps defray some of the tuition costs of the graduate students who are pursuing studies in the Science field.	Grant: \$3,156
